We all aspire to a happy, peaceful humane society. NEP 2020 has articulated this aspiration as an equitable and just society.

Possible Approaches

There are two possible approaches when we are working on doing a critical analysis of the present state or on finding solutions to existing problems-

- Focusing on the Problems and trying to find their Solutions- **Problem Centric Approach**
- Focusing on the Solutions and trying to evaluate the Problems as an absence of solutions- **Solution Centric Approach**

In the first approach, we are generally trying to look at problems that we are facing and try to find solutions to each of them. But in this approach, we tend to focus on problems and get worried about them, which has a lot of implications (both psychological and material). Any amount of worry does not bring the solution. Secondly, we take individual problems and try to solve them in isolation; while many problems may be caused by some single source, or these problems may be interrelated. In the second approach, we try to understand how we can ensure living a fulfilling life for oneself and all, and then work for such a living (what is called a solution) generation by generation.

Prevailing Approach

The prevailing approach today is the first one (**Problem Centric Approach**) while we need to take the second one (**Solution Centric Approach**) as this works sustainably.

Proposed Approach

Taking this 'Solution Centric Approach', we need to develop a holistic perspective about human existence and work out the programs for a fulfilling life that can be universal.

Program and Steps for Humane Society

For successful implementation of these programs, we need the dimensions of Education, Health, Justice, Production and Service, Exchange, Right Utilization, Security and Administrative Service in society. The primary step to move forward is to develop the right understanding among human beings, the commitment to live accordingly, and then to develop the requisite skills and knowledge systems to implement the right understanding in real life. Here we can work out four steps for transformation:

- Step 1: Steps for Individual Transformation to Human Consciousness
- Step 2: Creating Mass Awareness towards Holistic Development
- Step 3: Moving towards Humanizing the Mainstream Education
- Step 4: Developing Models for Holistic Living in Educational Institutions and in the Community

A lot of effort has to be done. We have 9000 institutions, where it (UHV-I, UHV-II, and minor degree in UHV) must be implemented – only we have to sustain the efforts and see how best we can propagate this to every institution.

He said he was so happy that AICTE had already joined hands with UHV and had started working in this direction 4 years ago.

The whole idea for organizing this for AICTE staff is that we need to practice this ourselves first before taking it to others.

He thanked all the volunteers who have been doing service without expecting anything and wished all the best for the journey of UHV to be taken to everyone.
