PROPOSED STEPS FOR TRANSITION TO HUMANE SOCIETY

In the monthly meeting of April 2023, the keynote lecture was presented on 'Proposed steps for the transition to Humane Society'. In the March 2023 keynote lecture, we saw that there are two possible approaches when we are doing a critical analysis of the present state or finding solutions to existing problems viz. **Problem-centric approach** and **Solution-centric approach**. The **prevailing** approach today is the first one while we need to take the second one. In the '**Solution Centric Approach**', we have tried to develop a holistic perspective on human existence. Through this, we can identify our goals at all levels and work out the details of the dimensions of the system to fulfill these goals:

- Education and Health take care of our physical & mental well-being.
- Justice takes care of relationships in human interaction.
- Production and Service, Exchange, Right Utilization and Preservation ensure that our requirements of physical facilities are taken care of, along with complementing the rest of Nature.
- To enable these dimensions to function without failure, the dimension of Service at the level of the system is required.

There are three programs to be taken up while working on all the dimensions of society:

- People's Education Program: It is meant for adults from different walks of life. It introduces the people in general to the program and outcome of value-based living.
- Education-Sanskar Program: It is meant for children right from primary education to higher education to ensure their value-based living.
- Undivided Society, Universal Human Order Program: It includes value-based programs for all the dimensions of society including Education, Health, Justice, Production and Service, Exchange, Right Utilization, Security and Administrative Service in society to ensure Undivided Society and Universal Human Order.

Going by these proposed steps, we get a definite program for human tradition, where human goal is achieved generation by generation.



3-day UHV Volunteers Meet, 14-16 April 2023, Manaviya Shiksha Sanskar Sansthan, Kanpur (face-to-face, self-funded)
