Completeness of Right Understanding with Realization of Co-existence

A Human being is a co-existence of self (I) and body. Self is central to human existence and has the potential to ensure the right understanding and right feeling in completeness by awakening to the activities of contemplation, understanding, and realization. This potential reflects natural acceptance in the self which is innate and invariant. By referring to Natural acceptance one can develop contemplation (Relationship- Natural Characteristic, Participation in Larger Order), Understanding (the clarity of Harmony in Nature- Self-organization, Innateness), and Realization (the clarity of Co-existence in Existence-Submergence of Nature in Space). The awakening of higher activities starts with Contemplation and completes with Realization. With realization, the right understanding becomes complete. This is the state of continuity of Harmony within and the ability to see that the whole of nature, which is the collection of units, is submerged in space. Being submerged in space, every unit is:

- 1. Energized
- 2. Self-organized
- 3. Recognizes its relationship, fulfills its relationship with every other unit

Space, the all-pervading, is No-activity, while every unit is an activity in itself and active with other units. Space is unlimited, while every unit is limited in size. Space is transparent, and every unit recognizes its relationship and fulfills its relationship through space. The units are two kinds: material and consciousness. The material units are limited in size as well as time, and thus temporary. The consciousness units are limited in size but unlimited in time, and thus continuous. Space is unbounded in size as well as time, and thus ever. Material has the activity of recognizing and fulfilling while consciousness has the activity of knowing, assuming, recognizing, and fulfilling. In the whole existence, only the consciousness is in disharmony, being unable to awaken to the activities of contemplation, understanding, and realization. Once the realization is awakened, there is activity-completeness in the self. When the same gets authenticated in living, there is conduct-completeness in the self. This is the development of the self. Rest every activity in nature is cyclic, while the development in the self is linear, acyclic. In the process of development as a human being, we all have to work to awaken to the activity of realization. This is facilitated by our participation in programs for undivided society, universal human order, and human tradition.
